Short Biography

Dr. Hakuyo Ebara is a supervisor of Sanda City Himawari special school and chairman of NPO of WELnet Sanda in Japan. He has a bound of experiences in international society for children and their health. He was a board member of Hyogo Pediatric Association in 1996. In 1999, he involved in a medical team to rescue injured people by ChiChi Earthquake in Taiwan. Then, he became a Vice-chair of International Committee of Japan Pediatric Association (JPA) in 1999. In 2001-2002, he joined Karez-Kai which is a NPO to improve health and education for children in Afghanistan and established a clinic for refugees and wounded people in Kandahar. He still supports this clinic until present.

After ChiChi Earthquake, with a cooperation of Taiwan Premature Baby Foundation, Dr. Hakuyo Ebara started to coordinate NICU medical doctors and nurses to be trained in Japan's NICU until present. He also established a national network of "once NICU experienced pediatricians" called "Infant Health and Development Network" to serve those NICU graduated babies having difficulty living in community in Japan. Since 2014, he became board member of Japan Pediatric Society (JPS), especially focusing on children in medical complex condition, such having gastric or tracheal tubes, even with ventilator living in community and/or facilities. For these reasons, he started skill training for pediatricians, nation widely.

In April 2017, Dr. Hakuyo Ebara coordinated team of Taiwan Association of Child Development and Early Intervention (TACDEI) came to Sanda City, inspecting nursery, school for children having medical complex condition, also activity of NPO of Welnet Sanda, which has been serving these children by running respite, day care, also group home, where he has been president since 2016.
